MILKWEED HELPS BUTTERFLIES

If you have noticed Monarch butterflies, which many think are the most beautiful butterflies in Naples this summer, it is not a fluke. There has been an awareness on the part of our members and Naples gardeners that the beauties are in decline and that planting, Asclepias, an American milkweed, hosts and feeds the Monarchs in their growth cycles.

In spring, Monarchs fly north from their central Mexico winter site and lay their eggs on the plants. They hatch into caterpillars which munch on the milkweed. When grown, the caterpillars spin chrysalises, fuzzy cocoons, and,voila! change into butterflies. They linger on the milkweed for a few hours and then off they go floating on the sea breezes.

Barbie Barker Litterst and Jan Dark are two members with a good number of plants. The Bellas have planted milkweed around the flagpole at the fountain, and the Naples School NIGC member gardeners planted Asclepias by the kindergarten gate. The plants are sturdy, love sunshine, need water and can be cut back in the winter.

Plant one next spring!
