GARDENER'S GALLEY

From the Kitchen of *Ginny Clark*

Israeli Couscous with Apple, Cranberry and Herbs

- 2 Tbspoons olive oil
 - 2 cups Israeli couscous (or barley or orzo)
 - 4 cups low-sodium chicken broth
 - 1/4 cup chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley
 - 1 1/2 Tbspoons chopped fresh rosemary leaves
 - 1 teaspoon chopped fresh thyme leaves
 - 1 medium green apple, diced
 - 1 cup dried cranberries
 - 1/2 cup slivered almonds, toasted
- Vinaigrette:**
- 1/4 cup apple cider vinegar
 - 3 Tbspoons maple syrup
 - 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
 - 1/4 cup olive oil

For the Vinaigrette:

In a small bowl, combine the vinegar, maple syrup, salt and pepper. Whisk in the olive oil until smooth. Pour the vinaigrette over the couscous and toss to coat evenly.

Cook's Note: To toast the almonds, preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Arrange the almonds in a single layer on a baking sheet. Bake for 8-10 mins or until golden brown. Cool completely before using.

For the couscous: In a medium saucepan, heat olive oil on medium high heat. Add the couscous and cook, stirring occasionally, until slightly brown and aromatic, about 3-5 minutes. Add the chicken broth and bring to a boil. Simmer for 10-12 mins. or until the liquid has evaporated. Transfer the cooked couscous to a large bowl and set aside to cool. Add the parsley, rosemary, thyme, apple, dry cranberry and almonds.



Olive Tree Treatment

RPW Services, a horticultural company, treated the four somewhat-healthy olive trees in mid August. The treatment was paid for by NIGC. An antibiotic to combat the bacterial scorch condition, *Xylella fastidiosa*, was placed in small containers with tubes into the trees. This antibiotic is being used by RPW on recommendation of UCR entomologists who are fighting the state wide scourge caused by the sharpshooter insect. The insect enters the tree through a cut in the bark.

A systemic insecticide to prevent the sharpshooter insect from spreading the disease was then heavily sprayed on the exposed root flare.

Next step for the trees will be a careful pruning of all the dead wood on the four affected trees, probably in October.

On June 18th, a lovely orientation was held for new members at Marilyn Bittle's home. Seven new members were welcomed and a delicious lunch was served by the "hostess with the mostest." Club goals and projects were high-lighted, and information and answers were pointed out that could be found in the roster. Please introduce yourself to them at the general meetings.

Have you Noticed the Olive Trees?

Many members and residents are commenting on the appearance of the olive trees at La Bella Fontana Park. NIGC retained *Soil and Plant Lab* in 2011 and again in 2015 for leaf, bark, and soil testing of the trees to evaluate their health in scientific detail.

In both evaluations, *Xylella fastidiosa* was identified, caused by the glassy winged sharpshooter, an insect that is causing damage throughout California. The disease's common name is bacterial leaf scorch for which there is no cure according to the California Department of Food and Agriculture. Several olive trees in the park are in advanced decline and all trees exhibit symptoms of the disease.

Don Easterby, PRM, is working with the city arborist on the issue; he keeps in contact with our Club as they work together on the trees.

If you are unsure of any of these, then reconsider if you should be a sponsor.
